

The Sheffield City Council Regular Session was called to order at Sheffield City Hall by Mayor Scott Sanders, at 7:00PM on Monday, May 10th, 2021. Council Members in attendance were Jill Peterson, Nick Wilson, Dave Smit, Brad Mulford and James Robbins. Also, in attendance was Pat Nuehring, Public Works Director and Police Chief, Brad Gardner.

Mayor Sanders led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Wilson made a motion to approve the agenda and Smit seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Sanders announced that it was the time and place for the public comment. The council heard from a concerned resident in regards to the special meeting held and felt it was not handled the correct way. The council also heard from another concerned resident regarding a dog at large and the council informed them that the dog owner has been warned and will be cited if it happens again. The library historian talked about the project they are doing with a grant that was received to preserve Sheffield's History. A resident spoke about the possibility of dust control on the full gravel road of 255<sup>th</sup> street.

Smit motioned to approve the consent agenda, Peterson seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously. Those items approved in the consent agenda were: 04/12/21 Minutes, 04/28/21 Special Minutes, May 2021 Bills and April 2021 Finance Report.

Mayor Sanders asked the department heads to give brief updates to the council. Police Chief Gardner stated the RMS is right on track and will go live on May12th. He also stated the new radios are a bit larger but very clear. PW Director stated the cemetery has been seeded and looking to work on getting the pool up and going by the end of the week. There have been a few water leaks recently but they have been fixed. The City Clerk stated that the meter read numbers are down to only five that aren't reading correctly. Also, she is working on getting more set procedures in place.

#### **Old Business**

- Regarding 112 Gilman, Sanders updated that we have been denied the grant due to needing more bids and to know what the long-term development could be for the empty lot. The council asked what the levy would be with full amount being figured, the city clerk will bring that to the next meeting.

#### **New Business**

- Robbins motioned to approve the sponsorship of the Mains Street Flower Pot. Mulford seconded and it was approved unanimously.
- Mulford motioned to approve the current dust control with the addition of the start of gravel portion on 255<sup>th</sup> street going west to the curve. Smit seconded and it was approved unanimously.
- Smit motioned to approve Chris Noss' tax abatement, with corrections changing property use to residential and exemption option being residential. Robbins seconded it and it was approved unanimously.
- Wilson motioned to approved the FY Budget Amendment. Smit seconded it and roll call was as follows, Ayes: Peterson, Wilson, Smit, Mulford, and Robbins. Mayor Sanders declared the resolution approved, adopted, and numbered 21-39.
- Smit motioned to approved a resolution for funds transfer to balance out funds. Robbins seconded it and roll call was as follows, Ayes: Peterson, Wilson, Smit, Mulford, and Robbins. Mayor Sanders declared the resolution approved, adopted, and numbered 21-37.
- Robbins motioned to approve 1st Reading & Adopt ordinance #141; Peterson seconded it and it was approved unanimously. Smit motioned to waive the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading; Robbins seconded it and it was approved unanimously. Smit motioned to waive the 3rd reading; Mulford seconded it and it was approved unanimously.
- Five new life guard applications were submitted. Three were hired with authorization to previous council approval of up to 10 guards. Smit motioned to approve a resolution to higher two additional life guards. Peterson seconded it and roll call was as follows, Ayes: Peterson, Wilson, Smit, Mulford, and Robbins. Mayor Sanders declared the resolution approved, adopted, and numbered 21-36.
- Mulford motioned to approve a resolution for the mayor to sign a contract with Mosquito Control. Peterson seconded it and roll call was as follows, Ayes: Wilson, Smit, Mulford, and Robbins. Mayor Sanders declared the resolution approved, adopted, and numbered 21-38

Smit motioned to adjourn, Robbins seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Adjournment at 8:10PM.
